

SPECTATOR AND PARENT CODE OF CONDUCT

- Do not force your child to play
- Do not stray on to the pitch at any time
- Do not verbally abuse match officials - remember, they are volunteers
- Do not verbally abuse players or other spectators
- Do not use bad language
- Do not threaten or intimidate
- Do not become involved in physical aggression
- Do not do anything which is likely to offend by way of insult, humiliation or discrimination



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As a club the aims of our Coaches/Team managers is to -



1. Create a positive and safe environment where every child feels valued and motivated to play Rugby
2. Coach and develop all players skills whilst observing the “Core Values” of Rugby
3. Give positive feedback to each child, encouraging 2 way communication as a way of developing skills and confidence
4. Give regular feedback to parents/Carers, including any breaches of discipline, fostering an open and honest partnership
5. Ensure each player is “Rugby Ready” before any match is played and that they where possible aligned with opponents of comparable standard
6. Respect every child’s personal limitations....no child will ever be forced to play Rugby
7. Ensure all new players are integrated into a squad at a rate appropriate to the players ability
8. Ensure every child has fun

Contact Coaching, A Touchy Subject



Over 9's Rugby brings new challenges and new skills to develop within teams. Including -

- Scrums (uncontested)
- Rucking
- Mauling

These skills do require some more “technical coaching” methods. This may include coming into physical contact with players to help them understand, the correct body positions, binds and stances to prepare the players for the new season.

Safety of our young players is of paramount importance to everyone involved with BSRFC. Each coach within our groups have at least the “Rugby Ready” certification, The requirement for each coaching session to have at least one coach with a DBS (old CRB) certificate will be observed. Physical contact will be kept to an absolute minimum and proportionate to the activity.

Training dates/Times



The season runs from September to early May, training is held at the pitches at the Westmancote site between 10:00am-12:noon on Sundays, Please arrive promptly for player registration. A parent/carer must stay on site for the duration of the training session, no child will be permitted to play or train without an appointed adult being on site for the duration.

In addition to training, matches and tournaments will occur during the season where we invite visiting teams to play us or we travel to other clubs, the team manager will e-mail you to confirm dates and times, if your child is not available for a certain match, please let our team manager know. All fixtures are detailed on the club website. www.bredonrugby.org

We do rotate our squads for all fixtures to ensure every player gets to represent our teams. If your child has not been selected for a particular fixture, training will still continue at the Westmancote site should the particular age group coach choose.

We do not train over the Christmas and Easter period, or Mothers day, in the rare occasions that the pitches are unplayable due to waterlogging or freezing, training will be cancelled, sometimes at short notice – the website will be updated by 08.30 Sunday with changes.

After fixtures each child receives a free hot dog, parents/carers are invited to join the rest of the Mini's in the clubhouse bar at the main Bredon site in the village(unfortunately, not free)

Kit Requirements



Gumshields

Bredon Star operate a “pro gumshield” policy, players over 9yrs old will not be permitted to train or compete in matches for our club without one, this policy is rigorously enforced by our coaches and team officials at training, home and away fixtures. Other teams may have a differing policy, however our view is that Rugby should be as safe as possible for our young players, minimising the risks where possible.

Kit suggestions

Training Kit is available from the Club Shop on the website

Matchday Shirts are provided but remain the property of the club and should be returned when requested

Rugby/Football Boots (trainers for when the ground is hard), studs need to be in good condition

Headguards, these are not compulsory but are recommended

Base layers – you can always take it off if hot, but if you can't put it on if cold and you don't have it!

A Water bottle and a snack

Kit bag

A change of clothes (your child is very likely to get very muddy) is advisable

A brolly and a decent set of wellies are advisable for the parents

Please note that dirty boots and kit are not allowed in the clubhouse.

Be Prepared for the Season 2017



1. Parents must sign their child in and out for training sessions with the lead coach
2. Players Skills Matrix- This will help develop each player at an appropriate pace whilst giving each player a goal to work towards.
3. Player “Sin Bin” 😞 - This is aimed to ensure game day and training discipline is observed, it will be linked directly to the “Code of Rugby” and the “Core Values”, its not aimed to be a punishment, just a moment for each player to reflect on any breaches of the code.
4. Fund Raising - Our players may well be “Touring” this season, fund raising ideas are greatly received & support welcomed


